Roadmasters and General Foremen will add to Foreman's reports any information they may have in addition to that shown by Foreman in sending reports to Superintendent; Superintendent will make further additional notations and forward reports to Claims Department.

Foremen must report all cases of fire of any character, accidental or otherwise, occurring on or near right of way, especially where any probability of fire having been set by Company employes or locomotives. Fill in all blanks and show under remarks any additional information that is obtainable in order that full record of case may be given. Show names of all employes or others who may be known to have witnessed fire or know anything about it.

In case of serious fire Foremen must make wire report to Roadmaster or General Foreman, as the case may be, and to Superintendent. State what burned and if known, cause of fire and time, following with a mail report promptly. Superintendents will make fire report to Assistant General Manager and Claims Department.
